e. Enrollment Report

BACKGROUND:

The 2015-16 FTE report as of May 26th is included for your information. We are currently 1.6% under our two year state-funded FTE target. In 2014-15 we ended up 3.1% below our state-funded target. This academic year we are currently 0.1% below our annual state-funded target.

As of the 10th day of spring quarter, state-funded FTE was 4% over spring 2015, headcount was up 6.7% from the 10th day of spring 2015. The increase in state-funded FTE is attributable to higher enrollment in ABE/ESL classes, including DVS 080 which was in the Academic category previously. As of May 11th, state-funded FTE is 2.7% (39) higher than this same day in 2015.

The tuition amount budgeted for 2015-2016 is \$4,200,000. As of April 30, 2016 we have collected \$4,192,032 or 99.8% of the budgeted amount. As of April 30, 2015 we had collected \$4,433,587 or 100.7%.

ATEC is a conference where all the Aviation Maintenance Technician (AMT) schools gather once a year. The conference started on Saturday April 9th and ended on Tuesday April 12th. This conference was both enlightening and very educational.

ITEM #8: Student Code of Conduct (action)

BACKGROUND:

On February 22, 2016, BBCC filed a Pre-Notice Inquiry with the Washington State Register regarding its Student Conduct Code, which was published on April 22, 2016. At the Board of Trustees June 10, 2016, regular meeting, a public notice was provided of BBCC's intent to amend WAC 132R-04 of Title 132R WAC.

Chapter 132R-04 Standards of Conduct for Students

Changes reflect compliance with the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA), Campus SaVE Act, and Title IX guidance from the Office for Civil Rights, as well as changes in the law regarding bullying, harassment, discrimination, sexual violence, educational records and personal use of marijuana. The changes are consistent with the recommendations in the model student conduct code and model hearing procedures for Washington community and technical college and BBCC Board Policy 6115, Policy Prohibiting Discrimination, Sexual Harassment and Sexual Misconduct.

A draft was attached for board review. A Notice of Proposed Rule Making which included the notice of hearing was filed with and published by the Office of the Code Reviser in the Washington State Register for public review and comment on April 22, 2016.

The public hearing for permanent adoption of the rules was announced for the Board's June 10, 2016 meeting.
