Career Outlook

The Commercial Pilot Training program combines course work in flight training along with other ground school courses to students for obtatining prepare commerical pilot certificate with instrument rating. To meet these requirements, most students require more than six quarters to complete the training. Additional ratings for flight instructor. instrument instructor, multi-engine, and seaplane may be earned through special arrangements.

Future Education Opportunities

Because most airlines and major corporations give hiring preference to pilots with a four-year degree, most aviation students choose to obtain the two-year transfer degree in order to complete their Bachelor's degree. This gives BBCC flight students more option and the flexibility to choose from a broader list of academic subject in which to major. Flight students choosing this degree option will have to take more credit hours to graduate than non-flight students.

Length of Program

90 credits = 6 quarters* if you take 15 credits each quarter.

*Your specific route may take longer than 6 quarters depending on the number of credits you take each quarter and where you start in your math and English pathways.

Which Quarter Can I Begin?

The flight program begins Fall quarter, though nonflight courses may be started any quarter.

Program Modality

This program cannot be completed entirely online. Flight courses are on campus. Some other courses are offered on-campus, online, or hybrid (part oncampus, part online).

Helpful Hints

- Cumulative GPA must be2.0 or higher
- Meet with your advisor each quarter to make sure you are on track!


