This course will provide students with the opportunity to gain practical, hands-on experience working with children infancy to age eight in a variety of educational settings and to reflect on the experiences. Students will be required to assist a classroom teacher for six hours per week throughout the quarter. Can be repeated up to nine credits.

Prior to registering for this course, students must pass a Department of Early Learning background check, provide results of a recent (within last year) Tuberculin skin test, and obtain WEA liability insurance, if needed.
