Big Bend Community College has emergency funding to support students facing financial hardships. We want to support you with the resources and tools necessary to continue your educational journey.

BBCC has been allocated federal and state emergency funding to help students who face financial hardships related to COVID -19. The federal Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II) is authorized by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA). The Washington State Emergency Student Relief Grants were authorized by the state in 2021. These funds can assist with the cost of attending or emergency costs that arise due to COVID-19. Such expenses include tuition and fees, course materials, technology, housing, childcare, transportation, medical and possibly other expenses due to COVID-19.

BBCC has additional emergency funding available to assist students who may not qualify for the funds described above or whose hardship may not be the result of COVID-19. More information about the Funding Sources is listed below.
