THE ARTS, ED & HS

The Homeland Security Management Program (HSEM) offers an opportunity for students to prepare for careers as emergency management managers and policy leaders, and to acquire the knowledge and skills needed to improve outcomes in a wide range of disaster situations. The curriculum provides policy foundations and advances students through core competencies in hazard identification; risk and vulnerability assessment; planning; terrorism; mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery; and planning for diverse populations. The AAS-T in Homeland Security Emergency Management degree will develop the students' competencies to prepare for and respond to all hazard environments, and includes an understanding of socioeconomic and cultural diversity issues.

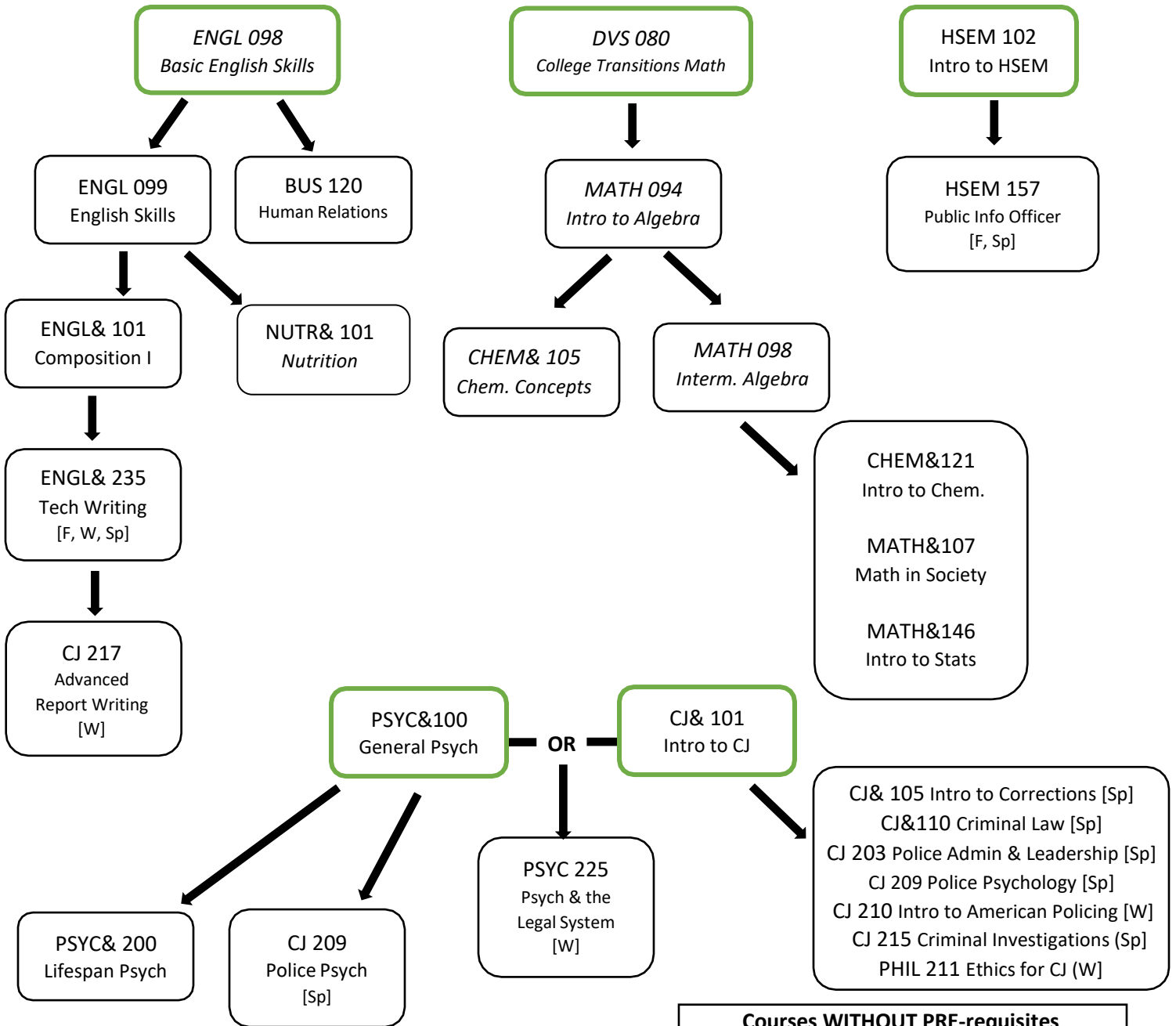
