COURSE CONTENT OUTLINE

- 1. Care for patients throughout the lifespan in a variety of settings
- 2. Focused care for patients experiencing perioperative nursing, fluid and electrolyte imbalance, alteration in respiratory function, maternal and newborn nursing, endocrine imbalance, musculoskeletal problems
- 3. Ethical considerations
- 4. Use of self-reflection tool for self-awareness and management of stress
