STEM Peer-Mentoring Agreement

Who is a TRIO STEM Mentee? A TRIO STEM Mentee is a current Big Bend Community College (BBCC) TRIO SSS student who has an interest in continuing their STEM education by transferring to a baccalaureate institution after graduation. A TRIO STEM Mentee engages in meaningful conversations with their mentor to enhance their academic and social preparation for transferring and commitment to a STEM major.

Who is a TRIO STEM Mentor? A TRIO STEM Mentor is a BBCC graduate who has transferred to a baccalaureate institution and is actively pursuing a STEM degree. A TRIO STEM mentor builds mentees' academic preparation for rigorous college course work, unveils campus resources, and serves as a role model aimed at increasing mentees' identity in their STEM discipline.

Disclosure in Mentoring Conversations: Disclosure is the process by which individuals share information that can be beneficial to the shared mentoring relationship. Information can be personal and often is considered important to the individual that is giving the disclosure. Conversations could include information about the individual's personal and academic experience. Disclosure between mentees and mentors is encouraged. It can be expected that both persons can and will share information about themselves. However, any information shared should be respected by each person in the mentee/mentor relationship. Please understand that the information may be shared with the STEM TRIO SSS Advisor and is not confidential. If at any time either the mentee or mentor feels concerned with any information disclosed, s/he should seek out the STEM TRIO SSS Advisor to discuss methods to address the issue in a positive and healthy way.
